Council Chamber, Bartlett Building, San Clemente, California, July 16th, 1931.

The adjourned regular meeting of the City Council of the City of San Clemente was held in the Council, Chamber; Bartlett, Butlding, San Clemente, California, Thursday July 16th, 1931 at 8.00 o'clock, p.m. - Mayor Murphine in the Chair.

The Minutes of the last regular meeting held Wednesday July 1st, 1931, were read and approved as read.

WRITTEN COMMUNICATIONS.

Communication from City Clerk advising the Mayor and Council that on Monday July 6th, 1931, the City Assessor deposited with him as City Clerk the Assessment Roll to property within the City of San Clemente subject to taxation for the Fiscal Year 1931-1932; was read and ordered placed on file.

Communication from Royal Indemnity Company asking the Council to forward them a letter stating that the liability of their Company under Bond S-3097-William A. Ayer, 'Street Superintendent, was no longer heeded and authorising them to 'sancel same; was read and the Clerk was instructed to write them to that effect.

ORAL COMMUNICATIONS.

Mrs. Sands, Santa Fe Railway. Company's Agent at San Clemente drew the attention of the Council to the urgent need of Comfort Stations on the beach to take care of the

many thousands of campers —

Mayor Murphine informed Mrs. Sands the Council had
already considered this and that plans were being printed
and estimates taken for a comfort station and that the
Council would try to do something before Labor Day. He
thanked Mrs. Sands for bringing this matter to the attention
of the Council.

Mr. George Scherck, Secretary of the San Clemente Chamber of Commerce stated he had been instructed to get in communication with the various Oil Companies to find out why San Clemente was paying half a cent a gallon more for gasoline than any other place in Orange County. He further stated the rate was ascertained by the mileage haul set by the State Railroad Commission and the only way is to have the State Railroad Commission reduce the freight rates from Los Angeles. He suggested any further action should be taken by the City Council.

The matter was referred to the City Attorney with instructions to report to the City Council the law on the matter.

COMMUNICATIONS continued - Mr. Scherck stated the Chamber of Commerce also suggested that the Library be kept open one night a week for an hour to enable persons to get books at night - Mrs. Thompson had written to the County Librarian for permission to open and as soon as the necessary permission was received the library would be open from 7 to 8 o'clock every Saturday night.

Mr. Scherck also asked that a Life Guard, with police authority, be stationed on the San Clemente Beach near the pier until after Labor Day and who could assist in cleming up the beach and make the people who use the beach take care of the rubbish and so forth. The matter was ordered to be brought up under the heading of "New Business".

Mr. Scherck further stated that when building the pier the timbers were all cut at the South Entrance and that persons boarding the pier from the South got their feet cut with the numerous sharp pieces of wood lying there and asked that some labor be expended there to alleviate that condition. The matter was referred to the Supervisor of Public Works with power to act.

Dr. J. B. Lape stated that the light in front of his house was taken away about a couple of months ago. He thought this was only a temporary arrangement but found the Electric Light Company had been instructed to eliminate that particular light and they took down the entire fixture.

Mayor Murphine said this had not been done intentionally, as although they had cut off several lights it was not the idea to cut out any light near any dwelling.

REPORT OF SPECIAL COMMITTEES Mr. Jas. H. Bermett, Chief of Police, made a verbal report regarding the Police Investigation of the complaints made by Mr. A. J. Jimenez and stated that as Mr. Jimenez had not produced any witnesses or affidavits in support of same the matter was continued until he could come before them with the necessary proofs.

This matter was ordered continued till next meeting of the Committee of the Whole Council. .
